I have just recently purchased land from Gus and Dina Sonneveld on May 1, 2006. The legal description of the land is: Survey TR PL, LT 154, Raleigh-Kent. I have talked to Guy about this. Gus and Dina owned approx. 200 A of land adjacent to each other and they sold 48.5 A to me and the remaining amount to another person, therefore, that land is now leased to two names rather than just one. The reason I am telling you this is to make you aware of this change when you are placing the wind turbines. I attended the meeting in Merlin on June 7 and I have some concerns. I saw on the map showing wind turbine placement that there are three turbines on the 200 A previously owned by Gus and Dina. I think they were turbines 37, 38, and 39 but I am not sure. I said before the land is now divided into two parcels with two separate owners with myself being one of them. I see the 3 turbines are lined up North to South on the 50 A directly west of Lot 154 (Lot 154 is the land I own). I find it somewhat upsetting that one landowner gets 3 and another landowner that is directly east of the land gets 1. I was told that moving one turbine will affect the placement of other turbines but in this situation the amount of movement would be minimal (50 m). I hope my request will be taken into consideration. The personnel representing the KEPA project have always told us that they will work with the landowners. Thank you for listening to my concerns. I have long thought about wind as an energy source, especially since I do live in that area, in the country, where the wind does blow. With open land around me, notably to the west, are you considering the study inland from the lake, or strictly along the lake banks? Another concept that I believe has potential is solar heating on roofs. I know there are many that seem to have a hand in this concept, but I don't think the full potential has been explored. Considering that every house has a roof, as well as the pole barn sheds all around the country, I think there could be a great deal of development in these areas. I know just how hot my shingled roof gets, and it's not nearly as hot as the steel roof on my 40 x 80 shed. There are two ways that the roofs could be useful, first with solar panels, secondly circulating water systems. In combination these could easily provide a great deal of environmental energy savings. I have read that some places offer payment for kw that are returned, and this offers yet another incentive to people to become involved, especially when our farms are suffering financially.
